# How to Change a Jejunostomy Tube (J-tube) Dressing

## ☐ Option 1

## Step 1

- ☐ Gather your supplies:
  - ☐ 1 drain sponge
  - ☐ 1-inch silk tape
- ☐ Wash your hands.



## Step 2

■ Put 1 drain sponge under the bumper of the feeding tube.



## Step 3

- Fold the first side of the drain sponge inward toward the bumper.
- Cover the bumper completely.



## Step 4

- Fold the other side of the drain sponge inward toward the bumper.
- Cover the bumper completely.



## Step 5

- Use 2 pieces of 1-inch silk tape to secure the dressing.
- The tape should touch the tube part of the J-tube. You should not see the bumper.



## Step 6

■ Put a piece of 1-inch silk tape on the loose tubing.

- Keeping the J-tube secure will help you feel more comfortable. It will also help keep the J-tube from moving or leaking.
- Follow any directions you receive from your surgeon.

## Step 1

- ☐ Gather your supplies:
  - ☐ 1 drain sponge
  - □ segmented Medipore<sup>™</sup> tape
- ☐ Wash your hands.



## Step 2

■ Put 1 drain sponge under the bumper of the feeding tube.



## Step 3

- Fold the first side of the drain sponge inward toward the bumper.
- Cover the bumper completely.



Step 4

- Fold the other side of the drain sponge inward toward the bumper.
- Cover the bumper completely.



Step 5

- ☐ Use 3 segments of tape to secure the dressing.
- ☐ The tape should touch the tube part of the J-tube. You should not see the bumper.
