

Care After Receiving Medicines To Help You Relax During Your Test

General Information

You were given medicine(s) during your test to keep you comfortable and relaxed. These medicines will last for several hours, even if you think you have recovered from their effects.

These medicines can affect your judgment, coordination and reaction time.

Follow this information if you had medicine for:

- pain relief
- muscle relaxation
- anti-allergy
- anti-anxiety.

Home Care

- You may be dizzy, drowsy or have a dry mouth. These should go away within 24 hours.
- Do not drive a car, use mechanical equipment or make major decisions for 24 hours. The medicine(s) may make you drowsy, slow your reflexes or affect your judgment.
- Do not drink alcohol or take other pain medicines that could make you dizzy or drowsy for 24 hours (call your health care provider or pharmacist if you have questions).
- Return to your normal diet.

When To Call Your Health Care Provider

Call your health care provider if you have any of the following:

- heavy drowsiness
- rash
- itching
- shortness of breath or breathing problems
- have any questions or concerns.
