How to Use a Suction System at Home

Suction System

Your health care provider has prescribed that you use a suction system at home. A suction system helps to clear fluids from your mouth, nose or windpipe (trachea).


You can rent a suction system from your local home medical supply store.

Parts of the System

- tubing (A and B)
- canister
- on/off switch
- vacuum gauge
- filter
- mouthpiece
- vacuum knob
- suction cups


How to Set Up and Use the System

- 1. Place the system on a table or other flat surface at least 4 inches away from other items. Gently push down on the system to make sure the suction cups hold it in place.
- 2. Tightly secure the lid on the canister. Connect the end (with the filter) of tubing A to the nozzle under the vacuum gauge and the other end to the nozzle (pointing up) on the top of the canister.
- 3. Connect one end of tubing B to the other nozzle (pointing out) on the top of the canister and the other end the mouthpiece.

- 4. Plug the system into an electrical outlet. Turn the system on by using the on/off switch.
- 5. Use the vacuum knob to adjust the amount of suction prescribed by your health care provider. Adjust for comfort, if needed.
 - To <u>increase</u> the amount of suction, turn the vacuum knob to the right (clockwise).
 - To <u>decrease</u> the amount of suction, turn the vacuum knob to the left (counterclockwise).

How to Clean the System

- **Filter:** When the filter looks damaged, discolored or clogged, replace it with a new one.
- Canister: Use warm, soapy water to wash the canister. Allow to air dry on a clean towel.
- **Tubing:** When the tubing becomes worn, replace it with new tubing.
- Suction system: Use a damp cloth to clean the system and power cords. Wipe the machine dry.
