

Making a Plan to Vote in the General Election

Make Your Voice Heard

Election Day is Nov. 8. You have 3 options for voting: absentee voting (by mail), early voting (in person), and Election Day at your in-person polling place.

Register to Vote

You can register before the election or at your polling place on Nov. 8. To learn more about how to register, go to:

Options for Voting Early

- by mail:** You can request a mail-in ballot. Your ballot must be received by Election Day or it won't be counted. You may also have someone else drop off your ballot on Nov. 8 (known as agent voting).

- in person:** You can vote early at a designated site. Dates, times and locations vary.

Know Where to Vote on Nov. 8

If you decide to vote in person on Nov. 8, know where your polling place is located. (It may have changed since the last time you voted.) Learn more at:
