Harmony[™] Prenatal Test

What is the Harmony Prenatal Test?

The Harmony Prenatal Test is a new test offered during pregnancy. It can detect most pregnancies with Down syndrome, Trisomy 18 and Trisomy 13.

How is the Test Done?

A blood sample is collected after 10 weeks of pregnancy. The results are reported as "high risk" or "low risk" in about 10 to 14 days.

This test has been shown to be more accurate than ultrasound and other blood tests, such as the first trimester screening or the quadruple test.

Is the Test Right for You?

You and your health care provider will decide if this test is right for you. Based on the current guidelines, this test may be offered if you:

- are age 35 or older at delivery
- have given birth to a child with Down syndrome, trisomy 13, or trisomy 18
- have "high risk" first trimester screening or quadruple test results
- have an abnormal ultrasound with signs for Down Syndrome, trisomy 13 or trisomy 18.
