

# EMG (Electromyogram)

#### **EMG**

Your doctor wants you to have a test to tell how well your nerves and muscles are working. An EMG (electromyogram) test converts the electrical activity of a muscle when it is contracted (tight) and relaxed. The EMG gets information that X-ray, CT or MRI tests cannot get.

A doctor will do the test. The test takes 15 to 60 minutes.

## **Before the Test**

- You may eat your normal foods.
- You may take your regular medicines.
- Do not put any lotions, powders or oils on the part of your body being tested.
- Wear loose-fitting clothing.
- Do not wear jewelry.
- Tell the technician if you:
  - had a mastectomy
  - have a pacemaker
  - take blood thinners.
- You will be asked to wear a gown if you have an EMG in your shoulder, neck or lower back area.

If you need to cancel your test, please call at least 24 hours in advance.

## **During the Test**

You will need to lie still and relax as much as possible. Tell a member of your health care team if you need to rest or change positions.

- You will lie on a bed or reclining chair on either your back or stomach.
- A technician will tape small electrodes to the area to be tested. A safe, very low level of electricity will travel to the electrodes to stimulate your nerves.
- You will receive a number of short shocks of electricity. Some will be more intense than others. Equipment will measure how fast the nerves transmit electricity.

- The doctor will insert a tiny needle (the size of a pin) into the muscles being tested to record muscle activity.
  - Each time, you will be asked to relax and then move in a certain way to make the muscle tighten. You may feel slight discomfort when the needle is inserted or when your nerves are stimulated.
- The muscle's electrical activity will be recorded. This will show how fast impulses travel along the nerve, and the activity of your muscle. If the nerve or muscle has a disease or injury, your doctor will see this through the EMG activity.

### **After the Test**

- You may return to your normal routine.
- This test has no side effects.
- A doctor will review and interpret the results of your EMG.
- Your doctor will receive a written report of the results.
- You will receive the results from your doctor. Call him or her in 7 days if you haven't heard anything.
