

Breastfeeding in Public

Breastfeeding is a natural process that has many health benefits for baby and mom. You do not need to limit breastfeeding your baby solely in your home. Your baby has the right to breastfeed anywhere.

With a little practice, breastfeeding “on the go” in public will become part of your rhythm. There are many options for your privacy; see your nurse or lactation consultant for ideas.

Wisconsin has a statute that specifically allows women to breastfeed in any public or private location:
Wis. Stat. § 253.165.

Wisconsin also exempts breastfeeding from public indecency laws: **Wis. Stat. § 944.17(3), § 944.20(2) and § 948.10(2).**

Wisconsin does not have a law related to breastfeeding in the workplace. Note, however, that Section 4207 of the new Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act included a federal law that requires employers to provide a place, other than a bathroom, and reasonable break time for an employee to express breast milk every time she needs to for her nursing child for one year after the birth. **29 U.S.C. §207(r)(1).**



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
